Doty Island's Rock the Block Offers \$10,000 in Home Repairs Sept. 21-23, 2023

Something amazing is coming to Doty Island this fall - Rock the Block! Habitat for Humanity is helping lower-income Doty Island homeowners through their



Rock the Block program. The program is a partnership between Fox Cities Habitat, volunteers and sponsors to provide repairs and maintenance for property owners. Due to the generosity of community sponsors, Habitat is able to offer \$10,000 to each Doty Island homeowner in repairs that focus on safety and health. The \$10,000 is <u>free</u> - it is NOT a loan or payback program. To qualify, the resident needs to be the owner of the home and meet the income guidelines in the chart below. In total, Doty Island has approximately \$400,000 earmarked in donations to help our residents with their home repairs. That's a lot of money that can do a lot of good for our community.

Fox Cities Habitat's programs are not new to Doty Island. In 2016, Doty Island had its first Habitat Rebuild on Lopas Street, Menasha. The Doty Island Development Council board participated in the event (see pictures!) In 2017, they held the first Doty Island Rock the Block on the west side of Doty Island. Since 2017, Habitat has also built eleven new homes in our community.

The approved Rock the Block projects will take place over next six months or so. Due to contractor availability, there is some flexibility as to when your



projects will be completed—some may be completed immediately, while others may not be completed until next Spring. Habitat Fox Cities can assist with the following tasks: exterior repairs, accessibility, weatherization, landscaping, and Interior safety enhancements Availability for the home repairs are on a first come, first served basis. So, if you need a home repair, don't wait to give Habitat Fox Cities a call and ask for an application. Visit https://www.foxcitieshabitat.org/dotyrtb/ or call Habitat for Humanity at 920-954-8702. Don't fret if your income is above the threshold and you really need some assistance. Habitat also has a Brush with Kindness program which offers yard clean up and landscaping services at low or no cost.

Delicious and beautiful cocktails. crafted from their original recipes, are served from their bamboo bar outside or inside-a deck, pool side, a family room! You bring the quests and they bring all the necessary bits and pieces to serve the cocktails. In addition they provide Hawaiian shirts, hats, and leis to ensure everyone is dressed Tiki-appropriate.

Why Tiki? It's fun! It's festive and it's mobile. Island Tiki vintage, exotic cocktails with names like Mai Tai, Zombie, and Cobra's Fang, which take us back to the pinnacle of

Tiki-mania. You get to dress down and pretend you are back on the islands. Tiki culture is described as "Polynesian Pop;" a completely contrived concept combining South Pacific décor with Caribbean rum cocktails. It gained popularity in the 40s as military veterans returned from WWII in the South Pacific and wanted to bring the Islands back home with them.

While on a date in the 70's Chris and Jim had a Mai Tai at Kon Tiki Ports in Chicago.

Though they loved the experience, their paths did not cross into the Tiki world again until 2015 when they brings to your event again enjoyed Mai Tais, this time at Trader Vic's. That event sparked a renewed interest in Tiki that inspired their backyard tiki parties and a Mai Tai hunt that took the couple to over 30 different Tiki bars across the country. They have enjoyed sharing their love of Tiki cocktails and culture with friends and neighbors and after their son challenged them to do more in January 2022, the Tiki Mobile Bar was born. They now hope to share the world of Tiki on Doty Island, the Fox Valley, and beyond.

Captain David Ryan: Greatest Generation Hero

It is often called the greatest generation and for good reason. Thousands of young men volunteered and left their homes to fight in WWII. One of those was David Edward Ryan who resided at 133 High Street. He left home and enrolled as an aviation cadet in the Army Air Forces Preflight School for pilots at Maxwell Field Alabama. Cadet Ryan, a graduate of Neenah High, received ten hours dual flight instruction at Centre College, Danville Kentucky, Navy in the Mediterranean

before he was accepted as an aviation cadet.

Captain Ryan, a pilot of a B-24 and squadron leader, flew 48 missions in Italy before the war ended. He was honorably released from service, effective August 25,

1945. Ryan holds the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal which he has won four times, and the Presidential Citation and Battle Ribbons from the Italian, Balkan, and German offensive Theatres of War. His brother Robert also served as Petty Officer First Class in the



Theatre of War. David Ryan, this true greatest generation hero from WWII and Doty Island, was employed after the war in the paper industry.

Lowering the Crime Rates of Doty Island

As a kid, maybe you grew up leaving your doors unlocked or leaving your toys in the front yard. Unfortunately, today leaving your personal items outside has a good chance of the item being stolen or damaged.

DIDC recently obtained the 2022 AGS Crime Index for Doty Island from the Neenah Community Development Department, A Crime Index is an estimation of the overall level of crime in a specific area. The results are categorized as the following: <20 (very low), 20 to 40 (low), 40 to 60 (moderate), 60 to 80 (high), and >80(very high). Doty Island's Total Crime Index Number for 2022 was 77.

We sat down with Community Officers for Neenah and Menasha to find out what our most common crimes are on Doty Island and how we can help reduce the crime rate.

Most Common Crime

Theft of Property - Theft from vehicles is the most common occurrence. Several city blocks are hit at a time. The perpetrators look for unlocked vehicles from which they steal change, cash, and Page 6

other property inside. Property Crime - According to Officer Dan Hoernke, the Community Liaison Officer for Menasha, the reason the number of damage or graffiti complaints are higher is largely due to Smith Park. It is one of the largest parks in the City so unfortunately, we have people vandalizing the pavilion and bathrooms. According to Officer Joe Benoit, the Community Policing Officer for Neenah, most of the property crime is vandalism at Cook Park and the Trestle where people often mark up public areas.

What You Can Do

The 9pm Routine - These tasks are simple and easily prevent crime.

Menasha Community Camera Program - If you are a Menasha resident and have a Ring Doorbell or other home security system, add your contact information to the confidential database. By registering, you would be contacted by members of the Menasha Police Department only if there is a criminal incident within the vicinity of your surveillance

system. Residents retain complete control of their system. Registration Form: https://



Reduce the Opportunity for Crime - Officer Benoit suggested a few environmental ideas to significantly reduce the opportunity for criminals to act. Make your property less appealing to a criminal by adding motion lights. eliminating overgrowth, trim the bushes down, trim the trees up (from ground 3 feet), therefore reducing the amount of areas that a trespasser can "hide".

#9PM Routine

- **Remove valuables from vehicles**
- Lock vehicle doors
- Close the garage door
- Close, lock all exterior doors
- Turn on exterior light
